



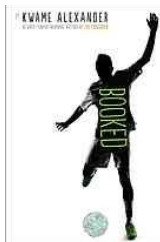
Ghost by Jason Reynolds

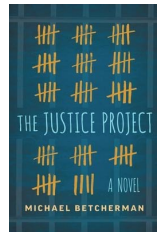

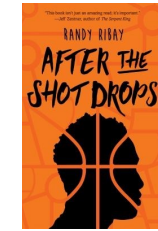
The big game by Tim Green

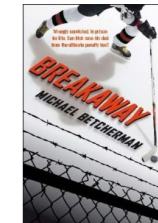
After the shot drops by Randy Ribay
