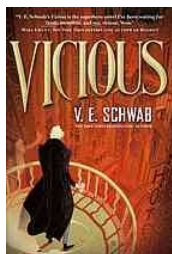




Steelheart by Brandon Sanderson

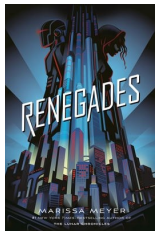

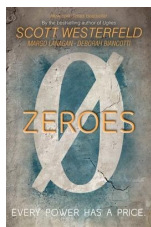
Infinity son by Adam Silvera
